### Social Justice Statement 2025-2026 - *Signs of Hope on the Edge*

As we entered the Jubilee Year 2025, Pope Francis reminded us that we are all "Pilgrims of Hope." Let us be a Church that brings healing, dignity, and hope. Let us walk with those who are homeless and mentally unwell, not just as service providers, but as neighbours and friends.

The Australian Catholic Bishops Conference 2025-2026 Social Justice Statement was released on Wednesday, August 13, 2025. The Statement titled "Signs of Hope on the Edge: Serving People Living in Homelessness and Mental Ill-Health" highlights the experience of people living with the challenges of homelessness and mental ill-health. Each year since 1940, the Conference has released a statement for reflection and discussion ahead of Social Justice Sunday on a key issue in Australian society.

School-Wide Positive Behaviour Support (SWPBS) offers a clear framework of structures and supports, provided there is a strong commitment to its implementation.

#### What is SWPBS?

SWPBS stands for School-wide Positive Behaviour Support. It's a P-12 Framework that schools use to improve student behavior, wellbeing, and academic outcomes by creating positive, safe, and supportive learning environments. It focuses on preventing negative behaviors and promoting positive ones through evidence-based strategies.
