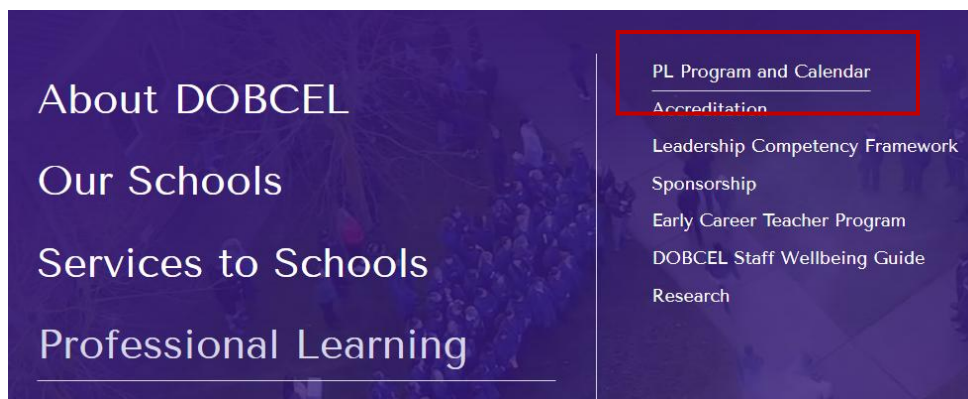


Purpose

S4SP – School Speech Programme Training

This PL will be focused on training Learning Support Officers (LSOs) who work with students in school Speech Support Programmes (SSP).

Importantly, this training will support LSOs who are working as the CEB Speech Pathologist's 'delegate' to implement the speech practice programme with fidelity.

It will also support the learning for diocesan early years classroom teachers who support students with speech difficulties in classrooms every day.

ABLES: User Level B Training

User Level B Training will develop your understanding and practice across two days. Follow up, online sessions will be led by CEB staff in report writing.

- Day 1 statistics & understanding scores
- Day 2 assessment admin, scoring & interpretation guidelines

The requirements for participants to attain the full User Level Accreditation are as follows.

Workshop attendees must:

- Register on Pearson Clinical as a test user. New registrations can be completed here: <https://www.pearsonclinical.com.au/accounts/create>
- Complete the two-day ABLE Training program
- Complete the administration and scoring of a minimum of nine ULB assessments in a “non-clinical setting” with 3 students.
- Demonstrate (to their supervisor) knowledge in the administration and scoring of the assessments by writing an Educational Assessment Report
- Submit “Approval for full accreditation as a User Level B” document signed by their supervisor after completion of the ten ULB assessments to finalise their accreditation as a User Level B.

Learning Outcomes:

- Develop knowledge and skills in the administration, scoring, and interpretation of assessments.
- Use assessment data to inform inclusive teaching practices, adjustments, and intervention planning.
- Communicate assessment findings clearly and accurately through professional report writing and consultation.

Deputy and Assistant Principal Senior Leader Program

The Deputy and Assistant Principal and Senior Leader Program is a three-year leadership development and formation program designed to support current and emerging senior school leaders in their journey towards becoming principal-ready.

The program brings together formation, leadership development, peer collaboration, reflection and workplace application, providing participants with opportunities to unpack leadership concepts, learn with and from colleagues across DOBCEL and apply their learning within their own school context. Across the three years, participants progressively build the confidence, capability and mindset required for future principalship.

Learning progressively develops from Leading Others towards Leading School, with participants meeting each term through a combination of online and face-to-face learning and formation.

Learning Outcomes:

Across the three-year cycle, participants develop and apply the seven Leadership Competency Framework competencies:

- Catholic Identity – Catholic formation, developing and leading Catholic school culture, ECSI, leading prayer, contemporary Catholic education and exploring Laudato Si' and stewardship.
- Collaboration – peer learning and sharing of best practice, working across schools, building professional networks, co-designing solutions and strengthening collective leadership.
- Communication – leading and facilitating effective dialogue, communication protocols, feedback, Crucial Conversations and working effectively with staff and stakeholders.
- Decision Making – evidence-informed school improvement, collaborative decision-making, establishing effective decision-making protocols and considering the broader and longer-term impact of decisions.
- Flourishing – developing understanding of student and staff wellbeing, psychosocial hazards, safe and inclusive practices, child safety and creating environments in which people can thrive.
- Managing Complexity – navigating learning diversity, behaviour support, competing priorities, change management and complex school-based challenges while knowing when to draw on the expertise of others.
- Respectful Relationships – building trust, understanding different perspectives, navigating conflicting demands and strengthening relationships through dialogue, feedback and collaborative practice.

Understanding Peer to Peer Harmful Sexual Behaviours

These sessions will support participants to develop a deeper understanding of peer-to-peer Harmful Sexual Behaviours (HSB), recognise the continuum of sexual behaviours in children and young people, strengthen confidence in responding to concerns and incidents, and explore practical, trauma-informed and prevention-focused approaches that promote the safety and wellbeing of all students.

Information from the Australian Child Maltreatment Study (ACMS) suggesting that Child Sexual Abuse by adolescents have increased was presented to the Board at its 1 April 2025 meeting. The Board noted the recommendation by ACMS that “targeted prevention of child sexual abuse by adolescents must be prioritised – raising another important issue for schools”. (Haslam et al., 2023)

Current safeguarding practices are mostly targeted at identifying and responding to individual adult perpetrators and overlook peer-abuse risks and contextual safeguarding practices. Current strategies are primarily aimed at preventing individual adult perpetrators from being employed (working with children checks/recruitment screening), understanding child safe violations (professional learning for staff, codes of conduct) or responding to abuse that occurs (Reportable Conduct Scheme). (Hunt et al., 2025, p. 9)

Peer to Peer Harmful Sexual Behaviours is a DOBCEL Board Priority.
